Similar collections are online via three free easy-to-access apps. Frank L. Weyenberg Library cardholders have access to electronic, downloadable versions, of all of the above. To make your life even easier, download three free apps onto your Apple or Android device. *Libby* offer ebooks and audiobooks. *RB Digital* offers magazines and audiobooks. *Hoopla* offers ebooks, audiobooks, graphic novels, movies, television series, and music. Since the pandemic began, the collections and access to all of these services has been expanded for your convenience.

Want to use this time to learn a new skill? The library offers a variety of services for your education and elucidation. Check out more than 350 six-week courses offered Gale Courses. They even offer language study. Want more languages? Log onto Rosetta Stone or Transparent Languages. Time to climb your family tree, Ancestry.com Library Edition is now accessible from home. Want to repair your car, click on BadgerLink then Auto Repair Source. There really is something for everyone at www.flwlib.org.
